CLAY COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION, INC. POLICY F-7 LIVESTOCK COMPETITION

- **F-7.1.** The Clay County Fair encourages livestock competition managed with strict adherence to applicable rules and generally accepted standards of conduct. Cheating or any other violation of show ring ethics will not be tolerated; offenders will be eliminated from participation and dealt with to the full extent of the Fair's authority and the law. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.2.** The Clay County Fair reserves to its Executive Committee the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incidental to the Fair. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.3**. Any person who violates any of the following rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Fair may order. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.4**. The Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage to or of exhibits. (12/21/21)
- **F-7.5**. No more than two entries in one class allowed an exhibitor, unless otherwise indicated. No exhibitor may win more than two prizes in any one class. (Editorial-6/7/17)
- **F-7.6**. All applications for entries must be made in accordance with guidelines found in the appropriate department exhibitor handbook. The Clay County Fair reserves the right to accept or reject any entry offered. (2/20/18)
- F-7.7 All entries must be received on or before the Monday two weeks prior to Labor Day (the Monday following the conclusion of the Iowa State Fair). Late entries will be accepted for 48 hours following the entry deadline with a \$25 per animal/per show late fee. (12/20/22)
- **F-7.8**. All exhibits must remain in place until the stated release time in each department. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.9**. Exhibitor questions on premium amounts or ribbon placing must be received on or before October 15, or no adjustments or corrections will be able to be made. Premium checks will be issued after that date. There will be no reissuing of lost premium checks, and premium checks that are issued will become void after 45 days. All awards, ribbons, and exhibits not picked up at the Fair Administrative Offices by October 15 will be forfeited and become property of the Clay County Fair. (2/20/18)
- **F-7.10.** The Fair reserves the right to deduct any outstanding invoices from premium checks before they are mailed to exhibitors. Outstanding invoices may include, but are not limited to, admission, parking, camping, entry fees, livestock bedding, and veterinary services. (2/8/22)
- **F-7.11**. The Fair will use diligence to ensure the safety of stock or articles entered for exhibition, after their arrival and placement, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or articles on exhibition. The exhibitor shall indemnify the Fair management against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. (4/17/12)

- **F-7.12**. Any animal eligible to be shown must be owned by the exhibitor when entry is made unless otherwise indicated in specific departmental rules. (2/19/19)
- **F-7.13**. Firms and partnerships entering for competition must be in existence at the time of entry, and in all cases must be bona fide. Affidavits of the age of the firm may be required by the Fair. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.14.** No animals may be entered or shown unless they have been recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds, except in case of young stock as otherwise provided for in special rules. Exhibitors must produce certificates of registry to the superintendent in charge anytime during the Clay County Fair. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.15.** No refunds on entry fees will be made. (4/19/22)
- **F-7.16.** All animals, except those being nursed, must be entered and shown in competition according to classes for their respective breed and species. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.17**. Where there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, judges may at their discretion award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animals or articles deserve. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.18.** For purebred breed shows, entries must be received from a minimum of three or more unrelated exhibitors who will exhibit a total of 12 or more animals in each breed offered for each species (unless otherwise specifically noted). At the time entries close, if sufficient entries are not received for a given breed, that show may not be held and the entry fees returned or breeds may be combined in an "All Other Breed" show. (12/21/21)
- **F-7.19.** All livestock trailers and trucks used by livestock exhibitors must be parked in the designated area in the north parking lot (north of West 18th Street). (4/17/12)
- **F-7.20.** A Clay County Fair department superintendent may not make a competitive entry directly in a Clay County Fair department over which that person has supervisory responsibility. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.21.** All animals entered must be exhibited in the division and class in which they are entered. (Editorial-6/7/17)
- **F-7.22.** No premiums will be awarded to any entries which have not been classified. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.23.** A faithful observance of all rules governing the exhibit will be required and when in doubt as to the application or meaning of a rule, the superintendent in charge shall construe the same. This opinion, when required by either exhibitor or judge, must be reduced to writing and returned with the award sheet. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.24.** The decisions of the official veterinarian will be final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion not discovered at the time of the award, is apparent. In such cases, the decision of the Fair's executive committee will be final. (4/17/12)

- **F-7.25.** In case of protest of an animal or exhibit, notice must be given the superintendent of the department during the day of examination of the animal or article protested, and a written statement giving the reasons for protesting, verified by affidavit, with names of witnesses, must be filed with the Fair. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.26.** The right of an exhibitor to appeal from the decision of a judge to the Fair will lie only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit; or when it is charged that the decision of the judge has been influenced or interfered with by another. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.27.** All questions of dispute or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to the Fair's Executive Committee whose decision shall be final. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.28.** The owner/exhibitor for each animal brought to the Fair must comply with the most upto-date "Health Requirements For Exhibition of Livestock, Poultry and Birds at State Fair and District Shows" that are published annually by the State Veterinarian and the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship, as well as any additional rules and regulations regarding animal care and animal health found in the Fair's exhibitor handbooks, on the Fair's website, or in other correspondence between the Fair and the exhibitor. (12/21/21)
- **F-7.29.** All the animals presented for exhibition at the Fair shall be subjected to examination by the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival and to daily inspections during the exhibition, even in situations where health papers for each animal are required. Separate health papers are required for each species. (12/21/21)
- **F-7.30.** The Fair reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone when such refusal is deemed to be in the Fair's best interest. (4/17/12)
- **F-7.31.** Limited livestock exhibitor camping is available on the inner Campgrounds. Requests for camping are limited to those individuals exhibiting livestock and may be made at the time of entry. (2/20/18)
- **F-7.32.** Camping may be reserved for the Friday before the Fair through Wednesday at noon, Wednesday of the fair at 2pm through Sunday, or for the full week. Campers may not be brought in before 2pm the day they are reserved, and must leave prior to 12pm the final day of the reservation. For individuals wishing to camp prior to the Friday before the Fair with utilities, additional camping fees will be assessed per night. (12/20/22)
- **F-7.33.** Each camper may have only one vehicle (with a parking pass) parked in the lot. Any additional vehicles will be requested to be moved. (2/20/18)

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

F-7.34. Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- A. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- B. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- C. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- D. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which cumulates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internal or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- E. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal is prohibited.
- F. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- G. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- H. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- I. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

J. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.

K. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statutes, regulations or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions. Swine Department Guidelines

- 1. Enter online at www.claycountyfair.com or complete appropriate forms available from the Clay County Fair Administrative Offices. ALL entries must be received on or before August 21st. Late entries will only be accepted for 48 hours following the entry deadline with a \$25./per animal/per show late fee added to entry fee. NEW 2023!!!
- 2. ENTRY fees are \$8.00 per animal /per show. There will be no fee for multiple animal classes. (There are 2 OPEN SHOWS: 1. open class purebred swine show Must be 6 years old or older on show day; 2. youth purebred show (exhibitors age 6-20). This fee does NOT include bedding.
- 3. There will be no fee for pens. Pens will be given based on 2 pigs per pen. Minimum, 2 junior pigs per pen. Any junior pigs (a junior pig is any pig born on or after January 1, 2023), other than boars, will be stalled 2 pigs per pen. Bring your own pen dividers if pigs need to be stalled separate. **Pen assignments will be at the discretion of the department superintendent.**
- 4. Exhibitors will be responsible for furnishing their own bedding, either by purchase at registration or by supplying their own. Bedding supplied by the exhibitor <u>must be wood shavings only</u> (no paper bedding, straw, hay, pellets, sawdust, or other materials allowed). Additional bedding will be available for purchase at the Fair.
- 5. Exhibitors must keep bedding clean and free of glass, plastics, cans and other trash for recycling purposes.
- 6. All exhibitors will be responsible for their own stall/pen clean-out.
- 7. There will be NO refunds of admission tickets, entry fees, bedding, stockman's passes, or tack stalls purchased.
- 8. An admission ticket is required each day an exhibitor enters the Clay County Fair. **Livestock Exhibitor Admission Tickets** may be purchased at time of entry (**before August 21**) for \$7.00. **After August 21**, advance admission tickets are \$8.00 or \$10.00 at the gate during the Fair. Children age 12 and under are free every day of the Fair.
- 9. Exhibitors may purchase **Stockman Livestock Parking** permit(s) for livestock vehicle parking on the fairgrounds. Permit must be purchased in advance and costs \$20.00 for the show period only. Parking is assigned in a color-coded area. **Free parking is available in the North Parking Lot.**
- 10. The livestock entry gate (Gate E) is located in the southwest corner of the fairgrounds.
- 11. Empty livestock trailers will be parked in designated areas in the North Parking Lot. Check location with the superintendent.
- 12. Exhibitors must be 16 Years of age to exhibit a boar unassisted, or show in one of the Purebred Boar Classes.

- 12. All entries must be made upon request. THE NAME, REGISTER NUMBER, PREMISE ID, APPROVED INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION TAG (A 4-H OR FFA TAG WITH NOTCHES WILL WORK FOR JUNIOR PIGS ONLY) AND DATE OF BIRTH OF EACH ANIMAL OVER FIVE MONTHS OLD MUST BE GIVEN.
- 13. An exhibitors meeting for all swine exhibitors will follow the show on Sunday, September 10th in the Livestock Pavilion.
- 14. Each exhibitor may enter no more than four (4) animals in each CLASS, but only two (2) animals are eligible for premium money.
- 15. Exhibitors are required to keep their pens clean & presentable at all times.
- 16. If a class is split into A/B sections, each section will be paid out as a class.
- 16. Exhibitor questions on premium amounts or ribbon placing **must be received on or before**October 15 or no adjustments or corrections will be able to be made. Premium checks will be issued after that date.

Livestock Camping Area

Livestock exhibitor camping reservations must be made online, along with your livestock entries.

The sites are reserved on a first come /first serve basis.

Please follow the instructions on the drop-down menus.

If you do not have internet access, please visit or call the Fair Administrative Offices to request a paper registration form.

On-Site Livestock Camping is <u>ONLY</u> available according to the following options:

1. Full Week - \$225 (9 nights)

- 2. Friday 2pm Wednesday noon \$125 (5 nights)
- 3. Wednesday 2pm Sunday 7pm \$100 (4 nights)

Single camping days are <u>not</u> available during the Fair

Reminder -- ON-GROUNDS EXHIBITOR CAMPING IS LIMITED!

Only ONE campsite will be issued per family.

ONE vehicle may park on the campsite with the camper.

NOTE:

Lots are 40'x22' – slide-outs should no reach wider than the site. Lots have limited amenities and <u>ARE NOT drive-thru</u> accessible.

During peak times, <u>sites may not be able to handle</u> all electrical items such as large air-conditioners/heaters etc. Sites vary between 50&30amp.

A 30amp adaptor may be needed

Water hookups are available at each site, but sewer options are not offered. A dump stations is located in the public campgrounds across the road from fairgrounds.

Shower facilities are located in the Livestock Pavilion.

- 3) Exhibitors must own pigs a minimum of 60 days prior to the show.
- 4) Pedigrees are required, and pigs must be transferred 45 days prior to the show.

- 6) Each breed champion and Reserve will receive a rosette.
- 7) Grand Champion and Reserved Grand Champion Barrow of all breeds will receive a banner.
- 8) A Grand Champion pen of three will be selected from the winners of each breed and they will receive a banner plus \$200 in premium money.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD – Banner - Exhibitor receiving the most premium money in each Division or Breed (in open show only). If there is only one entry in a class, the Premier Exhibitors Award points will not be given in that class.

- 1) Exhibitors must be between the ages of 6-20.
- 2) The purebred market pig class will be shown by breed.
- 3) Breeding gilts are encouraged to enter the purebred swine show on Saturday, September 9th.
- 4) The same pig cannot be entered in both Market Pig and Breeding Gilt classes.
- 5) Exhibitors may enter as many breeds as they wish.
- 6) Exhibitor may enter a limit of 4 purebred breeding gilts and 4 market pigs per breed.
- 7) Exhibitor must own pigs a minimum of 60 days prior to exhibition.
- 8) Pedigrees are required, and pigs must be officially transferred through Swine Association a minimum of 45 days prior to exhibition.
